CIVIL LAW and COMMON LAW

Louisiana is the only Civil Law jurisdiction in the country, meaning that disputes in the private sector are primarily settled by reference to the Louisiana Civil Code. The other 49 states are Common Law jurisdictions, where disputes are resolved by legal precedents created by judicial decisions over time. At Loyola College of Law, students can choose to focus their studies or with a Civil Law curriculum or a Common Law curriculum, depending on where they intend to practice. Should a student wish to develop competency for both kinds of jurisdiction, the student may focus their core curriculum in Civil Law and obtain a Common Law Certificate or focus on Common Law and receive a Civil Law certificate.

To earn the **Civil Law Certificate**, Common Law students must take Civil Law Property, Conventional Obligations, and one of the following:

- Successions
- Sales and Leases
- Civil Law of Persons
- Louisiana Donations and Trusts
- Community Property
- Security Rights

To earn the **Common Law Certificate**, Civil Law students must take Common Law Property II, Commercial Transactions, and one of the following:

- Contracts II
- Common Law Property I
- Trusts and Estates
- Secured Transactions

Students earning either certificate must satisfy the Perspectives Course requirement by taking Western Legal Tradition or Comparative Law. Both certificates require a student to satisfy the Perspective Course requirement by taking either Western Legal Tradition (3 hrs.) or Comparative Law (3 hrs.).
